STUDENTS CONTINUE ON THE FAST TRACK


Avondale Elementary School District is excited to announce the addition of a new opportunity for middle school students to participate in a Spanish fast track high school program this year.

Dual immersion 7th grade students at Desert Thunder will now have the opportunity to attend high school Spanish courses. AESD has been providing fast track opportunities in algebra, band and choir for multiple years and has added Spanish to the list, due to the effectiveness of the collaboration between the two districts and the impact on students' academic success.

Students have the opportunity to earn high school credit before their time in high school begins. Through the collaboration between AESD and AFUHSD, scholars are transported weekly to the high school campuses to engage in the enhanced course offerings..

"Our students get enhanced learning opportunities and get a powerful introduction to the high school staff and schools while still in middle school. Students are set up for success in their high school years and build confidence connections to teachers and peers in high school," says AESD Superintendent, Dr. Betsy Hargrove.


